The Town of Ansted held its regular monthly council meeting on Thursday, April 8, 2025, at the Ansted Council Chambers, located at 104 Cemetery Street, Ansted, West Virginia. Those in attendance were Mayor Stephen Pridemore, Recorder Robert T. Wilson, Councilmembers Greg Brewer, Anthony Harmon, Holly Jeffers, Maggie Crist, (Josh Cameron was absent) and Chief of Police Kevin Willis.

Mayor Pridemore called the meeting to order at 6:30. Greg Brewer led the meeting off with the Pledge of Allegiance and Mayor Pridemore led everyone in prayer.

The March 2025 Council meeting minutes and the 2025-2026 Budget Meeting held March 11, 2025, minutes had been provided to the council prior to the meeting. Greg Brewer, moved they be approved as presented, seconded by Anthony Harmon, the motion passed unanimously.

The March Financial reports had been provided to the Council prior to the meeting by email. Recorder Wilson moved that be approved as presented, seconded by Maggie Crist, the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore advised council no Sewer Upgrade update at this time except for the Shentel Internet for the Sewer Plant which will be addressed later in the meeting.

Mayor Pridemore gave the council a copy of an ordinance that the City of Smithers had adopted and is using regarding Dilapidated Property. He indicated that he would be meeting with Larry Harrah, town attorney, to draft an ordinance for our community. He encouraged the council to read and advise him of any concerns they may have.

Mayor Pridemore gave council a draft copy of the Town of Ansted Comprehensive Plan for council to review, getting close to public meetings to review the plan.

Mayor Pridemore a plan to gain 28 parking places along Log Town Road which is covered by the State of WV Department of Highways, he had met with their representatives and proposed to them to install 370 feet of culvert and drop inlets at an approximate cost of \$12,352.65, they had also looked at 8 places along Rich Creek Road, but at a cost of \$650.00 a place was not cost effective at this time. Maggie Crist moved that the Town should move forward with this project at an approximate cost of \$12,352.65, motion seconded by Greg Brewer, motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore provided council with a copy of a proposal from Shentel to provide Internet service to Pumpstation #1, Pumpstation #2, Treatment Plant, and the Town Garage, cost is \$2,860.00 per month on a five-year commitment total outlay would be \$171,600.00. Mayor Pridemore moved to pass on the Shentel proposal and check on other options to provide said services, seconded by Maggie Crist, motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore provided council with a quote from Mountain Heating and Air to replace the upstairs unit at town hall, which had failed and was not cost effective to repair, this quote was to replace upstairs unit with complete Gree 16 Seer2 H?P systems rated down to -22 degree F, at an expense of \$7,250.00. Mayor Pridemore moved that we proceed with this Quote sense it was lower than the previous ones obtained during the remodel, but he would get them updated, Greg Brewer seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore reminded council of the Laying of the Levy Meeting Tuesday, Aril 15, 2025 at 6pm. Town wide trash day is scheduled for April 25, 2025, pass the word.

With no other business to conduct, at 7:18 pm, Robert Wilson made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Greg Brewer. Motion passed unanimously.



The Town of Ansted held its regular monthly council meeting on Thursday, May 1, 2025, at the Ansted Council Chambers, located at 104 Cemetery Street, Ansted, West Virginia. Those in attendance were Mayor Stephen Pridemore, Recorder Robert T. Wilson, Councilmembers Greg Brewer, Anthony Harmon, Holly Jeffers, Maggie Crist, (Josh Cameron was absent) and Kevin Bowles, Chief Sewer Operator, Lori Osborne, Clerk, Marshall Clay, House of Delegates Member, and Clay Riley, Thrasher Engineering.

Mayor Pridemore called the meeting to order at 6:30. Anthony Harmon led the meeting off with the Pledge of Allegiance and Holley Jeffers everyone in prayer.

The April 2025 Council meeting minutes and the Laying of the Levy Meeting held April 15, 2025, minutes had been provided to the council prior to the meeting. Greg Brewer, moved they be approved as presented, seconded by Anthony Harmon, the motion passed unanimously.

Recorder Wilson read the financial report for the Municipal side but with the date of the meeting being the first the Sewer side would be provided to the Council by email tomorrow May 2, 2025, (note these accounts reflected zero at the meeting but Council was provided the numbers reflected on the second of May, 2025.) Greg Brewer moved approval as read, seconded by Anthony Harmon, the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore turned the floor over to Clay Riley of Thrasher who gave Council an update on the various sewer upgrade phases, beginning with Phase III, I and I, the grant is funded for this work, plans compete couple of places in Log town were sewer goes under houses and they would be working to move those, plans and permits have been forwarded to the DEP, for review and would be working to get right of ways updated.

Phase IV, another I and I project, grant funded to remove, replace, and repair lines.

Phase II, Mr. Riley provided a copy of West Virginia Water Development Board Minutes, of which the Town application for 4,753,000 of funding was approved. This project has an estimated completion date of September 2026. This is part of the \$13,360,000 needed to upgrade the plant to 500,000 gallon per day, with repairs and upgrades to the sewer plant.

Phase I addressing some issues with pumps that were upgraded and installed, he is working with Precision Pump to get these items addressed and fix and correct a Junction Seal that was missed in the initial planning.

Mayor Pridemore introduced Delegate Marshall Clay, who is our delegate, he advised council that he had served for 18 years as the Seargent of Arms in the house before running for office, currently resides in Cunard.

Mayor Pridemore introduced Kevin Bowles to the Council and asked him to discuss two Purchase orders for two quotes from Caldwell Pump services LLC concerning parts and repairs to the sewer plant for the day-to-day operations. Greg Brewer moved with approval of both purchases, seconded by Maggie Crist, the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore advised council that he had received a quote from New River Engineers, Inc, to provide a field survey to determine the property corners, establish property lines (existing and new), set new Monuments to represent the conveyance of real property, and to create a Plat of Survey Map, concerning property along Mill Creek, one on the Russel Hill side of the creek, with Duck Chapman and the other on the other side, with Jim Pack. Both pieces have had ownership issues and questions in the past. The Chapman property is needed for access to the Hawks Nest Trail, so that equipment can get to the trail to work on it, these machines cannot go across the big trestle, also with the repairs to the trestle hikers with not be able to access the trail from the trail head, since the trestle will be closed during the repairs. Greg Brewer moved approval to proceed, seconded by Anthony Harmon, the motion passed unanimously.

Lori Osborne advised the council that the Accounting and Billing Software was postponed at this time, gathering more information.


Greg Brewer moved that council go into executive session at 7:24, Maggie Crist seconded the motion.

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

Mayor Pridemore provided Council with a Sewer Upgrade update. Everything is still moving forward, and funding is looking promising. Phase 3 bids and Phase 2 design should be done by the end of the year. Mayor Pridemore said the issues at lift station #8 are still waiting to be verified but could be terracotta pipes broken within the ditch line. Lift station #2 has not received a power bill since 2022, but the error is on AEP's side and will be fixed and back-billed soon. However, they can only back-bill for up to six months. After pulling data on historic power bills/usage, it has come to our attention that all of the upgraded lift stations are consuming more KW of power and we will continue to check into why.

New Business

Clerk Wilson presented the 2024-2025 General Fund Budget Revision #3 (attached). Anthony Harmon approved the revision as presented, Greg Brewer seconded, and it passed unanimously. Clerk Wilson then presented the 2024-2025 Coal Severance Fund Budget Revision

#2 (attached). Anthony Harmon approved the revision as presented, Greg Brewer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Pridemore previously sent Council a copy of the proposed Unsafe Structures Ordinance to review. He would like the council members to review and make any needed changes, etc. and have a 1st reading of the ordinance at the July 2025 meeting.

With no further business to conduct, Councilman Brewer made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Anthony Harmon seconded, and it unanimously passed. Meeting adjourned at 7:12 PM.
